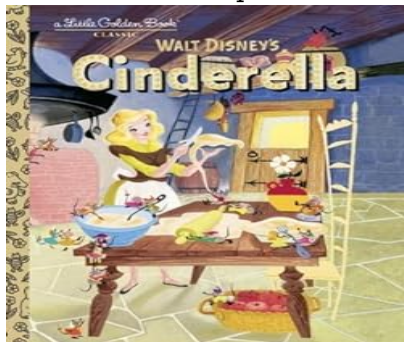

I'm not much of a fan of the Cinderella story to start and the Disney changes don't improve it: Being a fan of horror but one way or another this really isn't a good example of happy fairy tale. 0736421513 This beautiful adaptation of the Disney film comes alive with Jane Werner's words and Retta Scott Worcester's illustration adaptations. The reader will notice that the illustrations are similar to the film but some of the characters are drawn differently; this is especially noticeable with Cinderella. As a child this would have annoyed me but as an adult I really enjoy the detail in the illustrations and the new imaginings of the characters and background: The inside front cover and inside back cover are different illustrations - the front inside cover hints at what's to come and the back inside cover wraps up the story: 0736421513 5 stars!!!!
