The heroine Neisha was a sweet little Mary Sue who finally got the prince she'd been fantasizing about, Zufar was the proud stoic H who married the chambermaid of his runaway fiancée (the heroine from the more enjoyable novel Sheikh's Baby of Revenge) because he , had to have a wife since all the important guests and dignitaries had already arrived for the wedding (?) Lol. I also enjoyed seeing how the meek little former maid became a stronger dignified and beloved queen. Right ? On the plus side I suppose it can be seen by some that the H's abdication is a sign of his true love for the heroine: This is the H Zufar: This is the heroine Neisha: Sheikhs Pregnant Cinderella (Bound to the Desert King #2) These two were adorable together but the epilogue was lame.
